W.Rly Created Another Applaudable Record By Loading More Than 3.79 Crore Litres Milk During Lockdown



Ahmedabad, With the nationwide lockdown enforced from 23rd March, 2020, Western Railway, true as always being a forerunner in the service of the nation, maintained its wheels running to ensure the supply of essential commodities such as food grains, milk, medicines, groceries, coal, etc. across the country. Shri Alok Kansal - General Manager of W. Rly had taken keen interest to maintain the supply of essential

commodities during the lockdown and had ensured that utmost priority was accorded to such trains. As a result of this dynamic leadership, Western Rly has been able to reach a milestone of transporting more than 3.79 crore litres of milk during this time of acute emergency. Also, it is a matter of great pride for W. Rly, as it has earned the distinction of being the first Zonal Rly over the entire Indian Railways, to transport

such a high volume of milk during the lockdown period. WR GM Shri Kansal has appreciated & congratulated the entire TEAM WR including all the concerned officers & staff, for this marvelous achievement. According to a press release issued by Western Rly, 51 rakes of Milk Vans carrying 882 Railway Milk Tankers (RMTs) were transported from W. Rly's Palanpur (Gujarat) to Hind Terminal near Palwal in Haryana, ever since the

lockdown was declared in the country on 23rd March, 2020, till date. W. Rly is ensuring the supply of milk and milk products to different parts of the country through its milk special trains. In the month of March, from 22nd to 31st March, 5 rakes of RMT were loaded with 33.32 lakh litres of milk, while in the month of April, 15 rakes of RMT were loaded with 1.09 crore litres of milk. Similarly, in the month of May, 17 rakes of RMT were loaded with 1.28

crore litres of milk and in the month of June, up to 28th June, 14 rakes of RMT were loaded with 1.09 crore litres of milk. Accordingly, 51 milk special trains were run by Western Rly, with a load of more than 37 thousand tonnes and 100% utilization of the wagons, generating revenue of approx Rs 6.45 crores. In the similar period, 4.08 lakh Kg of milk products were also transported in the SLRs of these Rail Milk trains. This high quantum & volume of Milk transportation by W. Rly has created a record in itself over the entire Indian Railways, by being the first Railway to transport more than 3.79 crore litres of milk during this lockdown period. W. Told to wear a mask, Andhra govt official assaults woman; arrested



Hyderabad, The incident happened at AP Tourism Hotel at Dargamitta in Nellore town on Saturday afternoon. The police in Andhra Pradesh's Nellore district on Tuesday arrested a senior employee of the state tourism department for beating a woman colleague with a stick and abusing her for asking him to wear a face mask as part of Covid-19 norms. The incident, which happened at AP Tourism Hotel at Dargamitta in Nellore town on Saturday afternoon, came to light today when a video footage obtained from the closed-circuit television cameras of the hotel went viral on social media. "We have arrested the accused, C Bhaskar, working as deputy manager at the AP Tourism Hotel and he has been sent in judicial remand. A case was booked against him under Section 354 (assaulting a woman intending to outrage her modesty), 355 (using force to dishonour a person) and 324 (causing injuries using a weapon)," Dargamitta sub-inspector of police K Venugopal said. "Nellore

district police are extremely sensitive to any violation or crime against women. Women safety is our top priority," a tweet from the Nellore police department said.

According to the police, Bhaskar had been nursing a grudge against the 43-year-old woman, who is a contractual employee with the department. On Saturday, when he was talking to a senior accountant, Narasimha Rao, without wearing a mask, she suggested that he wear a mask because of the Covid-19 situation.

"Enraged at this, Bhaskar allegedly abused her, dragged her from her chair, caught hold of her hair and started beating her on her face and head with a stick pulled out from a wooden chair. He also insulted her in front of others," the SI said, quoting the complaint. Though other colleagues tried to stop him from assaulting her, he kept raining blows on her. Later, the woman, with the help of other colleagues, lodged a complaint with the police. Andhra Pradesh director general of police (DGP) Gautam Sawang directed the Disha police station (exclusive police stations to deal with crime against women) to take up the investigation into the Nellore tourism hotel incident and file the charge sheet within one week.

"Crime against women is unacceptable. We condemn the Nellore incident and action has been taken against the accused for manhandling the lady official," he said.

Delhi's Jama Masjid to reopen on July 4: Shahi Imam



New Delhi, The Shahi Imam said the mosque

The Shahi Imam said the mosque authorities are ready to reopen the place of worship only after safety precautions are put in place. The historic Jama Masjid will reopen for congregational prayers (namaz) from Friday (July 4), Syed Ahmed Bukhari, the Shahi Imam of the national capital's largest mosque, said on Tuesday.

Though the mosque was opened on June 8 amid the

easing of nationwide lockdown restrictions, which were imposed from March 25 to contain the spread of the raging coronavirus disease (Covid-19) pandemic, it was closed three days later because of a spike in the viral outbreak cases in Delhi. The Shahi Imam had sought public opinion before deciding to temporarily close down the mosque for congregational prayers until Tuesday (June 30). The move was also prompted by a personal tragedy for the Shahi Imam,

when his personal assistant for 20 years, Amanullah (57), had succumbed to the contagion. The Shahi Imam said the mosque authorities are ready to reopen the place of worship only after safety precautions are put in place. Mosque-goers have been requested to perform wazoo - an Islamic procedure for cleansing parts of the body, or a ritual purification - at home in a bid to maintain adequate social distancing and also urged to bring their own prayer mats.

China imports stuck at India ports show standoff casualties

New Delhi, Imports from China have been piling up at Indian ports pending government clearances, causing concern that a recent border standoff between the two nations could have an economic fallout that will disrupt supply chains. From active pharmaceutical ingredients that go into the world's most-consumed drugs to the innards of popular mobile phones, Indian companies purchase Chinese raw materials that feed their

finished products. These consignments are now being delayed and firms aren't sure why. "Customs authorities have not been clearing consignments coming from China, and they haven't been offering any reasons," Dinesh Dua, chairman of India's Pharmaceutical Export Promotion Council, said by phone. "It has been five days now. We have no source apart from China." Dua, who's also chief executive officer of Nectar Lifesciences Ltd., said

he has written to the ministries responsible for pharmaceuticals and trade to seek help as companies are spending about 350,000 rupees (\$4,630) a day in demurrage charges. Similar concerns are being voiced by electronics manufacturers, along with anxiety about how they will run their factories, only recently reopened after India's lockdown to contain the coronavirus. "Five consignments of mine are stuck," said Sudhir Hasija, chairman and founder of Karbonn Mobiles, which builds smartphones, chargers and set top boxes. "The government collected customs duty and GST on them.

As the country opens its borders with a gradual relaxation of rules, the need for information on the safety and cleanliness measures adopted remains high. Recently, Switzerland Tourism initiated the Clean & Safe campaign along with tourism industry associations to create a 'Clean & Safe' Label that will indicate that the establishments have made a

Switzerland systematically started relaxing its Covid-19 restrictions in three phases that were initiated on April 30, May 11 and June 8.
